

## Intergovernmental Agreements.

The following Ordinances and Resolutions embody intergovernmental agreements. While they may be of historic interests like those contained in the appendices, they are included here because they are not solely of historic interests, but are of continuing affect. Any person who desires to read the full text of any of the Ordinances or Resolutions may do so by consulting the original Ordinance Books on file in the Township Offices.

A. Local Government Investment Trusts.

A-1. An Ordinance of the Township of Clay, Lancaster County, Pennsylvania empowering the Township to participate in the Pennsylvania Local Government Investment Trust.

## B. Sewer

B-1. An Ordinance of the Township of Clay providing for cooperation under the Act of July 12, 1972, No. 180, and specifically delegating unto the Borough of Ephrata all functions, powers and responsibilities of Clay Township relating solely to sanitary sewer systems pursuant to Articles XV and XV-A of the Second Class Township Code in an area in the Southeastern part of the Township.

B-2. An Ordinance of the Township of Clay amending Ordinance No. 03-82: “An Ordinance of the Township of Clay providing for cooperation under the Act of July 12, 1972, No. 180, and specifically delegating unto the Borough of Ephrata all functions, powers and responsibilities of Clay Township relating solely to sanitary sewer systems pursuant to Articles XV and XV-A of the Second Class Township Code in an area in the Southeastern part of the Township” by extending the area of delegated authority Westwardly along Route 322 and in the Clay School area.

B-3. An Ordinance of the Township signifying the intention and desire of the Board of Supervisors to authorize the Ephrata Area Joint Authority of which the Township of Clay is a member municipality to engage in new types of projects being projects in the nature of sewer, sewer systems, sewer treatment works and the doing of all things necessary or appropriate to engage in such projects.

## C. Tax

C-1. An agreement between Lancaster County Tax Collection Borough (a Bureau created by certain School Districts of Lancaster County, PA, under authorization of Section 4 of the Act of June 25, 1947, P.L. 1145, and now continuing in operation under Section 10 (a) of the Local Tax Enabling Act of December 31, 1965) and the Township of Clay, Lancaster County, PA providing a collection agreement for earned income tax between the Borough and the Township.

#### D. Water

D-1. Ordinance signifying the intention and desire of the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Clay, Pennsylvania, to organize a municipal authority jointly with the Township of Ephrata and the Boroughs of Ephrata and Akron, under the provisions of the Municipality Authorities Act of 1945 as amended and supplemented, to be known as “Ephrata Area Joint Authority”; setting forth the form of the Articles of Incorporation; appointing the first members of the Board of Authority; designating the purpose of said Authority; authorizing the execution and filing of the Articles of Incorporation; and the doing of all things necessary or appropriate to organize said Authority.

## E. Streets

E-1. An Ordinance providing cooperation pursuant to 53 P.S. §481 et. seq. regarding delegation and sharing of functions, powers and responsibilities by and between the Township of Ephrata and the Township of Clay regarding the maintenance of streets “Agape Drive”, “Peaceful Lane”, “Hoover Drive”, and the Storm Water Facilities located therein in Charity Gardens Development.

## F. Insurance

F-1. An Ordinance authorizing the Township of Clay, Lancaster County, Pennsylvania, to join with other political subdivisions to enter into an intergovernmental agreement for the purpose of joining the intergovernmental insurance cooperative and to participate as a member of the cooperative.

## G. Police

G-1. An Ordinance authorizing the Township of Clay, Lancaster County, Pennsylvania, to join with other political subdivisions, the School District of Ephrata and the Ephrata Police to provide funding for the placement of a School Resource Officer within the Ephrata School District which serves Clay Township residents.
